## EasyAppsOnline Employee Quick Start - Ver. 3.0 (Rev. 09/01/2009) (With Census Upload)

### Opening EasyAppsOnline

1. Open Internet Explorer and go to
2. When EasyAppsOnline opens, enter your default username and password and click Go.  
\* Your default username is the *first 2 characters of your first name and first 6 characters of your last name*  
**(If your last name is less than 6 characters, use all letters of your last name)**  
\*\* Your default password is **password**.

3. Create a new password and click Save.
4. Create your security question and answer.
5. Click on the Apply on-line button to start the enrollment process.
6. Select Yes to the System Requirement Agreement page.
7. Complete the enrollment pages.

8. Sign your signature in the signature box using your mouse.
9. Congratulations. You have completed the enrollment process.
10. Click the Main Menu button to return to the Main Menu.
11. Log off EasyAppsOnline and close browser window to protect your personal data.



### QUICK TIPS TO SPEED THE ENROLLMENT PROCESS

HAVING THIS INFORMATION HANDY WILL MAKE ENROLLMENT AS EASY AS 1,2,3

1. **Social Security Number** and Date of Births for yourself and all dependents
2. **Previous Health Coverage** Information and **Concurrent** (Other) Health Coverage Information
3. **Medicare** Information for yourself and / or dependents if applicable
4. List of all **Medications** including **Dosage** for yourself and your dependents  
**Detailed Medical Information for yourself and all dependents (including the following):**  
Names of **Conditions**  
**Dates** of treatments  
**Physician's** name
5. Names of **Tests** performed or to be performed  
**Hospital stays, including dates,** for any condition  
Any **Surgery** information – details on past or future surgeries  
If you have **Diabetes** you need at least one A1C Reading  
If you have **High Blood Pressure** you need at least one pressure reading  
If you have **Elevated Cholesterol** you need at least one reading
